Brian Robert Parm, 53, of Elmwood, passed away on Friday, July 15, 2022 at the Richard L. Owens Hospice Home in Peoria.

He was born on April 12, 1969 in Oklahoma City, OK to his parents, Kenneth and Marianne (Geber) Parm. He married Julie Coulter on July 9, 2010, and she survives. spent in the hospital, at doctor's visits, or in his chair or bed fighting the chronic illnesses that he had. There were multiple times that he would be standing at the kitchen sink exercising to strengthen his legs and arms. During these years he loved going out to eat (when able) just to visit with people.
