George Albert Lambert, 83, of Pekin, passed away on February 22, 2022, at his home in the arms of his loving wife, Rose Mary.

George was born on April 30, 1938 in Berlin, NH to Robert A. and Rose D. (LaBrecque) Lambert. He married Rose Mary Burrell Dreher on August 10, 1978 in Dallas, TX.; she survives him.
