



Mary 'Lou' Finney

August 31, 1941 - December 5, 2021

Mary Louise "Lou" Finney, 80, passed away on December 5, 2021, at home with family in Mapleton, Illinois. Her memorial service will be held January 8th, 2022 at 3pm at Living Hope Community Church, in Bartonville, Illinois. Visitation will be from 1:00pm to 3:00pm, preceding the memorial service. A graveside service will be scheduled later at Smith Grove Cemetery in Greenville, Illinois.

Mary Lou was born August 31, 1941, to Commodore H. Mills and Norma Weiss Mills in Highland, Illinois. In 1962 she was married to John "Jay" Earl Finney Jr. and he preceded her in death in 2011. She was also preceded in death by her parents, stepmother Irma Weiss Mills, and stepbrother-in-law Bob Goodson.

She is survived by son John Earl Finney III (Kristi) and grandchildren Melissa (Jonathan) Carpenter, Megan Finney, and Nathan Finney. She is also survived by, stepsister Nancy Goodson, stepbrother Ron (Linda) Weiss, Aunt Alice Potts, nieces, nephews, and cousins.

Mary Lou was a graduate of Greenville College and taught high school in California, Texas, and Illinois. For 13 years she was employed at Methodist Medical Center at the University of Illinois College of Medicine in Peoria as Residency Coordinator. She and Jay spent 15 years in San Antonio, and she

was employed at Wayland Baptist University in San Antonio. She taught piano lessons since retirement.
