May 23, 1966 - December 10, 2022

Rusty Ray Stokes, 56, of Peoria died of an apparent heart attack in his sleep on December 10, 2022.

He was born May 23, 1966, in Peoria to Ray L. Stokes and Mary F. (Emrick) McDaniel. He called his parents every day and visited them several times a week. He was the epitome of a good brother to his three siblings, taking care of them in ways they were not even aware of.

Mischievous and playful, he often said what others wouldn't dare. Most of us remember laughing at something he said. He giggled at cartoons, chit-chatted with his beloved animals, and could drop a line so funny he'd crack up the whole room in an instant. In the next breath, he'd say the most thoughtful thing you'd heard in years. Authentic: that was our Rusty.

He made his family very proud. He lived a good, honest life and made this world a happier place. He'd want anyone who knew him to grab life by the tail and enjoy it, instead of being sad that he's gone. So go ahead: watch a comedy tonight. Hug your people. Help someone. Be happy. Look on the bright side of things because he sure did.
