Susan Shofstall Busch passed away July 7, 2023 in Peoria, Illinois. She was born to Rita Norton Shofstall and John Delbert “Jack” Shofstall on October 7, 1948 in Detroit, Michigan. As an Air Force brat, she moved frequently, living in Louisiana, Florida, Indiana, and Japan.
